RE: Surplus Asset Sale 2021

This year the Town of Fort Frances will again be putting up for sale old, obsolete, and no longer used materials, equipment, and vehicles. In July all departments we asked to take stock of items that were no longer used or needed and provide a listing. 71 items which can be found attached to this report were submitted as surplus and Council must declare these items as such.

Once these items are declared surplus, the following procedure will be utilized to dispose of the items:

- 1) Advertise in the Fort Frances Times - sale of obsolete materials, equipment and vehicles. All items will be posted online for the public to view.
- 2) People can submit bids on any or all items. Forms will be provided at the Civic Centre, 320 Portage Avenue.
- 3) The bids will be publicly opened in the committee room.
- 4) Payment will be due prior to removing any items from the Town's property.
- 5) Successful bidders will have two weeks to pick up their items.
- 6) Where no bids are received for a certain item, if possible, these items will be recycled and if not they will be disposed at the Town's landfill site.

RE: Proof of Vaccination

The Provincial Government has announced that it will be requiring some businesses to screen users/customers to ensure they are fully vaccinated before allowing use of those facilities beginning September 22, 2021.

Specifically listed in the announcement was Restaurants, meeting and event spaces, facilities used for sports and fitness activities and personal fitness training, such as gyms, fitness, and recreational facilities except for youth and recreational sport. The rules are in place for everyone who is eligible for a vaccine which is currently 12 years of age and older.

The Town will need to decide what it would like the policy on vaccine requirements to be.

- 1) The Town can choose to follow the minimum requirements as listed above and have different rules for different users of the facility. This will cause the staff to be put into difficult situations where they require certain people to be fully vaccinated while allowing others to enter without asking about vaccination status. The public could potentially be confused about whether they are required to be vaccinated to enter the facility, causing very difficult situations for our staff.
- 2) The Town can require all users/members/spectators/contractors of the facilities, 12 years of age or older to be fully vaccinated at least 14 days prior to accessing the facility. This option will allow the Memorial Sports Centre and Fort Frances Senior Centre to treat everyone walking through the door the same and allow messaging to be clear and concise about what is required to attend the Memorial Sports Centre or Fort Frances Senior Centre. Without a blanket policy that applies to everyone, we will be putting our staff and management in very difficult situations and that would be unfair and cause a great deal of stress and anxiety.

Recommendation

The Community Service Division recommends to Mayor & Council to choose the second option for our policy on vaccine proof requirements.

RE: Land based fitness classes

The Memorial Sports Centre is the fitness hub of the community. There are many activities held at the Sports Centre, which houses our Arenas, pool, gym, cardio room, and auditorium.

The Town has offered land-based fitness classes in the past depending on instructor availability and space to hold the classes. Our ability to offer these classes has diminished over the last number of years. The Fall 2021 recreator had 5 activities planned as land-based fitness options, but with the new regulations coming into effect on September 22, 2021, we will not be able to offer these programs. The cancelled classes mean that we will have no land-based fitness class options.

The Management Team at the Memorial Sports Centre has been working on plans to increase our offerings in the land-based fitness area since 2019, but many of these plans require additional dedicated space and equipment which will be realized with a potential expansion to the building. With the newest development the Town has had to speed up some of its plans to ensure that it is meeting its strategic plan. In the plan the Town states one of its objectives as "Maintain/enhance existing levels of service". With the loss of our land-based fitness classes we are significantly reducing the level of service available to the public and our paying members. Many members hold memberships simply to attend classes offered. The Town has been in touch with a couple of potential instructors and could begin offering land-based spin bike classes along with weightlifting classes. The spin bike classes would be an extension of our aquatic version of the spin bike we currently offer which is a popular class.

The Memorial Sports Centre does not currently own spin bikes, or the weights required to provide these classes. Initial research into the cost of the bikes ranges from \$1,500.00 - \$2,000.00 per unit and we would be looking to purchase 21 of these units which would be enough to offer classes and have them available in our cardio room as well. The weights/equipment we need to purchase range from \$5,000.00 - \$10,000.00 for the classes we would be looking at offering. The total expected outlay for this new offering would be no more than \$50,000.00. This is an unbudgeted Capital expenditure for 2021 so would need to be approved. The \$50,000.00 would come from the Vehicle and Equipment Reserves.

Currently there are two grant applications being evaluated which would cover 75% of a proposed and much needed expansion to our Pool and Gym areas at the Memorial Sports Centre. One of the costs that are allowed under one of the grants is equipment. What this means is that if we were to be successful in receiving this grant that the \$50,000.00 for this equipment would be eligible to be covered by the grant.

Recommendation

The Community Service Division recommends to Mayor & Council to authorize the unplanned capital purchase for additional equipment at the Memorial Sports Center to allow for land-based fitness classes to be offered.

RE: Memorial Sports Centre Membership Statistics May, June & July 2021

In the documents attached please find the monthly membership information for May, June and July 2021 with comparison to prior year. Of importance to note is that COVID-19 has significantly impacted operations and thus memberships at the Memorial Sports Centre. The Facility was closed for May, June, and July 2021.

With the facility being closed for part or all of 9 of the last 12 months it has caused memberships to be extended to ensure our customers were impacted as little as possible from the closure and allow them to use the facility for the time they had paid for. This extension and the previously mentioned closures have caused the number of new memberships purchased to be significantly less over the previous 12-month period and the effect of these closures and restrictions in place due to COVID-19 on new memberships will continue to linger into the fall.

Once we are through the lockdown phases of the pandemic and we are allowed to operate under minimal restrictions our memberships should stabilize.
